Scholarship Review Committee:

Applications for the LiUNA Local 837 post-secondary scholarships are judged by a Review Committee composed of individuals chosen by the Executive Committee of Local 837. There are no members of Local 837 or LiUNA on the Review Committee and all decisions on scholarships are made by the Review Committee and are final. All material and information on the applications that may identify the applicant are removed before they are judged by the Review Committee. Applications are judged based on three criteria:

- 1) the academic record of the student
- 2) the essay
- 3) citizenship

Each of these areas is given equal consideration by the Review Committee.

Application Information

This application has three parts. First, an official transcript of the student's high school, college or university record must be submitted. Second, applicants who are entering their first year of post-secondary studies must include a copy of their **proof of acceptance** (the offer of admission does not qualify) from the college or university they will be attending. Applicants in their subsequent years (2nd, 3rd, 4th ...) of full-time studies must provide **proof of enrolment from the Office of the Registrar**. Third, applicants must complete the Citizenship and Essay portions of this application.

Essays will be run through an AI checker and will automatically be forfeited if any AI is detected.
